去加拿大留學準備步驟

1.Choose a program.

Alberta's post-secondary institutions offer a broad range of programs: apprenticeship and industry training, continuing education, academic upgrading, or education at a college, university or technical institute.

2. Submit your application.

Contact the institution(s) directly to ask for detailed application information and forms, or apply online.

3. Apply for your study permit.

Apply for your study permit as soon as you receive your letter of acceptance from the Alberta post-secondary institution.

4. Send your official and complete documents by the deadline.

Submit all documentation on time to ensure that your application can be processed effectively and efficiently.

NOTES

Note: The admission application process takes time. Start compiling the necessary information and documentation at least one year in advance.



The information above indicate application processing times at Canadian visa offices outside Canada. The times are based on how long it took to process 80 percent of all cases between April 1, 2013 to March 31, 2014. Processing times are subject to change.



WORKING WHILE STUDYING

If you are interested in working in Alberta while studying, you will need to get a work permit for students.

International students may legally work while attending school in Alberta. No work permit is required towork on campus. If you are attending a post-secondary institution that is part of the Off Campus Work Permit Program, you may be able to obtain an off-campus work permit.

GET A STUDENT WORK PERMIT

New rules for prospective international students are now in effect (as of June 1, 2014).

It is possible to work in Canada while you are here as a student. In some cases, you will need to apply for a student work permit.

Work on campus
Work off campus
Work as a co-op or intern

Stay in Canada after graduation: you can stay in Canada as a permanent resident or find work after you graduate from school.

WORK ON CAMPUS

You may work on campus at the institution where you study without a work permit if:

•you are a full-time student at:

- a public post-secondary institution, such as a college or university, or a collège d'enseignement général et professionnel (CEGEP) in Quebec
- a private post-secondary institution that operates under the same rules and regulations as a public institution, and receives at least 50 percent of its financing for its overall operations from government grants (currently only private college-level educational institutions in Quebec qualify) or
- a Canadian private institution authorized by provincial statute to confer degrees and

you have a valid study permit.

WORK OFF CAMPUS

Study permit holders in Canada may gain work experience by working off campus while completing their studies.

As of June 1, 2014, you may qualify to work off campus without a work permit. If you qualify, your study permit will allow you to work up to

- •20 hours per week during regular academic sessions and
- •full-time during scheduled breaks, such as the winter and summer holidays or spring break.

To qualify, you must:

- •have a valid study permit,
- •be a full-time student,
- •be enrolled at a designated learning institution at the post-secondary level or, in Quebec, a vocational program at the secondary level, and
- •be studying in an academic, vocational or professional training program that leads to a degree, diploma or certificate that is at least six months in duration.

You do not need a work permit to work off-campus, but you will need a <u>Social Insurance Number</u>. It is your responsibility to look for work. Even if you work off campus, your studies must be the main reason you are in Canada.

WORK AS A CO-OP OR INTERN

For some academic programs, work experience is part of the curriculum. Foreign students who wish to participate in a co-op or internship program must apply for a work permit as well as a study permit.

To be eligible for a work permit, you must meet the following requirements:

You must have a valid study permit.

Your intended employment must be an essential part of your program of study in Canada.

Your employment must be part of your academic, vocational or professional training program offered by a designated learning institution, certified by a letter from a responsible academic official of the institution.

Your co-op or internship employment cannot form more than 50% (percent) of the total program of study.

You <u>will not</u> be eligible to work during your studies if: you study English or French as a second language (ESL/FSL), or you participate in general interest or preparatory courses.

STAY IN CANADA AFTER GRADUATION

To work in Canada after you graduate, you must apply for a work permit under the Post-Graduation Work Permit Program (PGWPP). If you want to stay in Canada as a permanent resident after you graduate, there are a number of programs available, each with its own requirements.

Get a post-graduation work permit

The PGWPP allows students who have graduated from a participating Canadian postsecondary institution to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Skilled Canadian work experience gained through the PGWPP helps graduates qualify for permanent residence in Canada through the Canadian Experience Class (CEC).

A work permit under the PGWPP may be issued for the length of the study program, up to a maximum of three years. A post-graduation work permit cannot be valid for longer than the student's study program, and the study program must be a minimum of eight months in length. For example, if you graduate from a four-year degree program, you could be eligible for a three-year work permit if you meet the criteria. If you graduate from an eight-month certificate program, you would be eligible for a work permit that is valid for no more than eight months.
