Taiwan Top University Strategic Alliance – Imperial PhD Scholarships

Funded by the Ministry of Education in Taiwan, five scholarships are available per year for talented Taiwanese students to study a PhD at Imperial College London.

Who can apply

- Taiwanese students from Top University Strategic Alliance universities
- Students with a strong academic background, meeting both the academic and English language entry requirements of Imperial College London

What does the Taiwan Top University Strategic Alliance – Imperial PhD Scholarship include

The value of the scholarship is approximately $\pounds_{30,000}$ per year with an increase to cover any tuition fee increases per year.

- Full payment of Imperial's overseas tuition fees
- Fixed bursary of the remainder towards accommodation and living expenses

Tuition fees vary across subjects and in some cases the stipend will fall below the recommended College minimum level. Students must ensure they have sufficient funds for living expenses in these cases.

How to apply

To apply, please follow these guidelines:

- 1. Prospective PhD students should approach individual departments and supervisors at Imperial with details of their proposed project. It is essential that students make contact with departments/supervisors before submitting a PhD application.
- Information about the Departments at Imperial can be found at: www.imperial.ac.uk/a to z
- 2. Students should submit the following scholarship application materials to the Alliance via their member universities by 10 October. Please check with your university for their internal deadline.
- a research proposal
- a statement on the applicant's aspiration/vision for studying for a PhD
- a CV detailing the applicant's academic qualifications, work experience, publications, professional qualifications, prizes and awards, extracurricular activities, volunteer work and community services
- a letter of support from the supervisor at Imperial
- scanned certificates/transcripts of Bachelor's (and Master's) degree qualification(s)
- reference letters from two referees who are able to comment on the applicant's academic and research capabilities. This will normally be academic staff involved in the applicant's undergraduate or taught postgraduate courses
- scanned certificate of the applicant's English language qualification

All scholarship applications are considered in the first instance by the Alliance. Applications are then shortlisted and forwarded to Imperial where they are reviewed and the top five students are selected to be awarded a scholarship. Successful candidates will be given a conditional funding offer letter (conditional on gaining entry to Imperial).

- Students must also formally apply to study at Imperial. Details about how to apply can be found at: www.imperial.ac.uk/registry/admissions/ howtoapplypg
- 3. Successful candidates that meet all of the College's entry requirements will receive a conditional offer of a place to study at Imperial. Candidates must confirm with the International Office that they have received an offer of a place at Imperial. The International Office will confirm the award of the scholarship at this stage.

Please note that students may start their application to study at Imperial before the decision on the scholarship has been made as it can take up to eight weeks to process the PhD application. However, the student must have established contact with the department/ supervisor at Imperial before submitting a PhD application.
