Ever since the early 20th century, the British in Hong Kong saw university education as a vehicle for promoting Western technology and values in the region. The University of Hong Kong stems from the British tradition of academia and prestige and, over the past 100 years, has developed and grown into a university with a deep-rooted tradition, history and core academic values with an international outlook. These values that are all in fact intertwined within the city of Hong Kong itself, bringing HKU into the 21st century as a world leader.

HKU's prestigious academic reputation around the world has labeled the University as the "Oxbridge of East Asia" (Times Higher Education). This merited success is rewarded with the surge of gifted students who come to study on its campus year after year. Places at HKU are highly competitive. For example, Mainland student applications have remained at over 10,000 for the past seven years for a mere 300 available places.

At the Heart of Hong Kong

Situated in the west of the financial and business hub of the city, HKU gains direct access to the city's central district, where the Island houses the headquarters of hundreds of multinational corporations. The location not only brings convenient transport to other parts of the territory but also opportunities for students to expand its network beyond the campus to engage industry leaders and innovators.

HKU has a total population of more than 27,000 students. Of the 15,000 undergraduates, roughly 20% come from outside of Hong Kong. At HKU, you get to enjoy the culturally diverse community and further blend into the global village that is the HKU community.

Credit transfer

Late application is accepted but will only be considered where places are available.
