Please note that foreign nationals participating in short study abroad programs such as the Ewha International Co-ed Summer College are able to stay in Korea for a maximum of 90 days without a visa.

All fees must be paid in Korean won (KRW). Students transferring foreign currencies should consider the exchange rate of the day, including bank commission.

Only electronically wire-transferred fees will be accepted. The sender's name must be identical to the applicant's name. Please notify the Ewha ISC office in advance via email if the payment is sent under another name.
